ArtsFest - Bringing many forms of art to Droitwich Spa Saturday 15 July to Saturday 5 August

Spanning 4 weekends and 3 weeks, *ArtsFest 2017* will probably be the largest arts festival ever seen in Droitwich. Each weekend has a different theme and the theme for the first weekend is music.



Voices Unlimited

The festival will be launched at midday on Saturday 15th July in St Andrew's Square by the Mayor of Droitwich and Nigel Huddleston MP. This will be followed by music from Voices Unlimited, "Sing and Tonic", and "Swing 42 (UK)" led by Mike Johns. Droitwich Spa High School pupils will perform in St Andrew's Church.

On Sunday 16th July, local musician Keith Slater will perform his Sinatra

Celebration at St Andrews Town Hotel, and on Monday evening come to the canal in Vines Park for the re-

enactment of Handel's Water Music, played on the Thames exactly 300 years ago.
